

# Return to School Checklist



## Classrooms

- Create at least a six-foot space between students as recommended by health officials
- Avoid positioning students face-to-face, especially when space is limited
- Add partitions to shared collaborative learning areas and clean them regularly
- Transition to assigned seating
- To keep students' belonging near-by and off the floor consider providing storage bins, backpack hooks, or book baskets

## Student Health

- Identify PPE needs and establish guidance for use
- Determine need and location for health check station
- Establish an isolation room for symptomatic students, faculty, and staff
- Publish a schedule for increased cleaning throughout the school day and additional cleaning measures after hours
- Position hand sanitizer stations in high traffic areas

## Administration

- Limit outside visitors
- Adapt lobby and reception areas to maintain social distance
- Install transaction screens at reception counters to limit exposure

## Common Areas

- Plan for modified use of collaborative spaces like libraries, cafeterias, and gymnasiums
- Implement scheduled use of common areas
- Define occupancy limits in shared spaces
- Post cleaning procedures so they are visible to everyone using the facility

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Ensure your school has the solutions needed to be safe, practical, and flexible during these uncertain times.

## In Preparation

Reconfigure classrooms, common areas, and administrative spaces as necessary

Provide visual cues for students to understand traffic flow and distancing measures

Dedicate a room to isolate those students, faculty, or staff who may exhibit symptoms

Train faculty and staff on new, enhanced cleaning and hygiene protocol

Create communication plans for use with the school community

Consult designers to help develop a plan to reconfigure spaces that ensure the health of everyone in the building while maximizing your available space

## During

Teach and reinforce healthy hygiene practices

Stagger use of common areas to avoid mingling separate classes

Limit nonessential visitors

Advise teaching staff, students, and administrators to maintain distance from each other

Update or add signage for directions, social distancing, cleaning, hand washing, and occupancy guidelines

## Ongoing

Lead with empathy and proactively assess needs with students and staff

Monitor and plan for absenteeism by cross-training staff and having a list of back-up staff available

Continue to coordinate with local health officials

Communicate updates to policies and procedures with the school community

Advise students and staff to stay home when sick

Consider long-term healthy school upgrades

- Hands-free pulls on doors and cabinets
- Improve air filtration and HVAC systems
