Institutional Stories of New Data Demands

- Formerly ho-hum data becomes mission critical
 - VPN utilization
 - Student engagement analytics
 - Room capacity
- University refunds \$10 million in tuition.
 - How to determine equitable qualifications
 - Budget Analysis for cuts
 - Accurate data for processing refunds
- Need to support a COVID-19 situation-room with urgent data needs
- Suddenly all your co-workers are working remotely
 - Need to collaborate in new ways
- Data security policies that are no longer reasonable

Needs and Goals

- Rapid, accurate, and trusted answers
- Clear paths from question to answer
- Ability to quickly make decisions on new types of data
- Having remote access to data knowledge
- Ability to have governance processes that can operate in asynchronous and remote pathways
- Empowering rapid decision-making
 - Defined roles and tasks for ownership
 - Easily extensible to new participants
- Transparency in the decision making





Best Practices

1. Just-in-time processes to manage data request within a framework of governance:

- Data Request process feeds in to all needed info:
 - Data Request
 - Specifications
 - Glossary definitions
 - Technical definitions
 - Data system inventory.
- All steps can pull in Steward/SME collaboration
- Framework that can include new people and systems






