

Nevada Requires Employers to Display New Poster by Oct. 1, 2021

Nevada has amended its unemployment laws to require employers to display and maintain a new poster published by the state's Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation (DETR). This new poster is available in both <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u>. The new law becomes effective on **Oct. 1, 2021**.

The New Poster

The new poster provides employees with notice of job training and employment programs conducted by the DETR. This poster will be updated as necessary to provide accurate information.

The poster names various resources available to employees and includes a number of web addresses employees can use to access more information about each program.

Displaying the Poster

Like with other required workplace posters, employers must display this new poster in a conspicuous location at the place of employment where notices to employees and employment applicants are customarily posted and read.

The Nevada Labor Division, part of the Department of Business and Industry, provides a <u>list of required notices and bulletins</u> employers can use to find all required posters.

Impact on Employers

Employers should access the new notice and make sure it is displayed as required by Oct. 1, 2021.

Important Dates

May 29, 2021

Nevada adopted AB 307 requiring employers to display a new workplace poster.

Oct. 1, 2021

Compliance deadline for displaying the new required employee notice.

The new poster is available in English and Spanish and must be displayed by Oct.

1, 2021.
