COVID/CDC New Travel Guidelines Update

We hope everyone is doing well. Vaccination numbers continue to rise, and we are beginning to see some positive changes as we make the journey out of this pandemic. As always, we continue to evaluate our internal protocols as well as monitor the guidelines put forth by the CDC and other respected health care providers.

The CDC issued new guidelines for travelers over this weekend. The following guidelines are from the CDC website:

- Fully vaccinated travelers are less likely to get and spread COVID-19.
 - The CDC defines people who are "fully vaccinated" for COVID-19 as people two weeks past receiving their second dose (Pfizer or Moderna) or people who are two weeks past receiving their single-dose vaccine (Johnson and Johnson).
- People who are fully vaccinated with an FDA-authorized vaccine can travel safely within the United States:
 - Fully vaccinated travelers do not need to get tested before or after travel unless their destination requires it.
 - Fully vaccinated travelers do not need to self-quarantine.
- Fully vaccinated travelers should still follow CDC's recommendations for traveling safely including:
 - Wear a mask over your nose and mouth.
 - Stay 6 feet from others and avoid crowds.
 - Wash your hands often or use hand sanitizer.

Based on these new guidelines, we will be adjusting our protocols.

TRAVEL GUIDELINES FOR SBC AND JACARANDA TRACE Domestic Travel

- Fully vaccinated residents and family members traveling will need to provide a copy of vaccination a Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test is no longer required. A copy of the vaccination card must be received prior to the visit or at the time of the visit to the community.
- Residents and family members <u>not</u> vaccinated must have a <u>negative Polymerase Chain</u> Reaction (PCR) test with test results no older than 5 days upon arrival at SBC or JT.

• Whether fully vaccinated or not family members traveling from out of the country will have to provide a negative PCR test with test results no older than 5 days upon arrival at SBC or JT. If vaccinated please bring proof of vaccination. After three to five days of isolation, we will require another negative PCR test.

Many of you have family scheduled to visit and we hope these guidelines provide the necessary guidance.
