RE: COVID-19 /Coronavirus Update #47B Travel Protocols

With the holidays rapidly approaching and family members scheduling more family visits, it is disheartening to us all that COVID-19 is still impacting our lives and creating the necessity for continued restrictions. The holiday season is also complicated by the advent of flu season. It is a reality we must face as a community as we continue to navigate through the pandemic utilizing the most current data available to us. The upcoming months will be complicated by the increasing number of virus cases in different states. We are taking this opportunity to update you on the travel protocols currently in place that were clarified in Update #47A on November 10th.

The **ONLY** COVID-19 test which we are accepting for entry into our communities is a Polymerase Chain Reaction Test, also known as a PCR test. **Rapid antigen/antibody tests will not be accepted.** Please share this information with your family and friends who are planning to visit, along with your private employees such as caregivers and housekeepers.

In-State Travel

The latest “hot spot” County list and map where the positivity rate is higher than 10% is attached for your convenience. This list is updated weekly based of the Florida Department of Health’s positivity rate. Please have your family check with Concierge Services before they travel to ensure the County they are traveling from is not currently on our list as a “hot spot”.
