

From 2009 – 2020




#### Texas Business Cycle Index and Leading Index



- - ► Weak August jobs report 235,000 (586,000 avg for the year)
  - ► National unemployment 5.2% (Covid low)
  - ▶ But...40% are long-term (six-months) unemployed
  - ► Weekly Covid unemployment benefits have expired nationally (since June in Texas)

The economy is undergoing massive changes. There's a big mismatch at the moment between the jobs available and what workers want.



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












Texas does not correlate with the United States...the United States correlates with Texas (and Florida)



#### **Texas Total Housing Sales by Price Cohort**




#8 on the numeric growth list and #3 on the percentage growth list (29.8% from 2010 to 2019).





Figure 54. Midland Employment Growth





Of the 13 counties in the >30% growth club, **Hays** and **Williamson** switched from Republican to Democrat in the presidential race.

The Democrats gained ground in 11 of the 13 counties. The other two were a wash.






- Republicans still have a winning streak in statewide offices that dates to 1994 (Bullock, Morales, Sharp...)
- Democrats picked up zero seats in the Texas House (including three close losses in Fort Bend County).
- Democrats picked up zero seats in the US House.
- Democrats lost ground in the RGV and among Hispanic voters generally.




This leads us to the most important demographic change...





Texas is the only state to add two Congressional seats (and two electoral votes) at a time where the margin in the U.S. House is eight members, with three vacant seats.







DIRECTION OF THE COUNTRY (OCTOBER 2009 TO AUGUST 2021)




