

Correlative Conjunctions Practice

Setting up the game: Set the stack of picture cards face down in the middle of the table. Get out the dice and place in the center next to the “dice key”. For each round, each person will need one blank card to write their sentence on. Set the others in the middle.

Play: The person whose last name starts nearest the end of the alphabet goes first, and becomes the judge. The judge turns over the first picture card for all to see. Next, the judge rolls the dice and looks at the “dice key” to determine which correlative conjunction is to be used in the sentence. Once everyone knows the correct conjunction to use, the judge sets the timer for 2 minutes and players begin writing a sentence about the picture card. Once the timer goes off, turn over the sentence cards and mix them up on the table. The judge then proceeds to read the sentences out loud and makes a decision as to who has the best sentence for the card and is written correctly. That player gets to keep the picture card as a point and then becomes the new judge.

Example:



Dice Key:

1. both... and
2. neither... nor
3. either ... or
4. not only... but also
5. whether ... or
6. FREE Choice

Dice roll- #3

Sentence: You need to either lick that ice cream or it's going to be a sticky mess!
