




Before Renovations Begin


Find Your Inspiration

We recommend, websites like <u>Houzz</u> and <u>Pinterest</u> because they are excellent sources of inspiration for all types of design styles.





This research into your home remodeling and architectural styles can be done individually and then come together to narrow down what is important. Budget Wisely

#1 Before any remodeling begins, it's important to know what you can afford to spend on your renovation project.

#2 A great resource that will guide you is the annual <u>Cost vs Value</u> guide published annually by Remodeling Magazine. This guide has regional data for our Texas cities, expected job cost for all types of remodeling projects and resale value projections



One part of that equation is your local real estate market. We use <u>HAR.com</u> to analyze the current homes for sale and past sales in an area to get an idea of the dollar/ square foot investment range. Use the map search option and turn on the sold tab.



You can also consult a local real estate agent to find out what renovated homes in your area are selling for so you don't invest more in the project than you may get back. This is especially important if you are considering selling your home within five years of completing the renovations.

After determining what to spend on your home remodeling project.

Prioritize design features into must-haves and nice-to-haves to stay on budget.

- * A must-have is an element that will change how you live in the space. For example, knocking down a wall to create an open living concept is a must-have.
- * Nice-to-have design elements are less important to how the space functions and are the area you can scale back on to save money.

A punch list is a list of minor items that need fixing once the main renovation is complete. A punch list includes things like chipped paint or a cracked sconce. Your contract should have a clause noting how punch list items will be addressed and how final payments will be handled. Thoroughly review your new space to make sure every last detail is perfect. Placing sticky notes on items is a great way to ensure all the final issues are addressed.
