Finally, I have been getting some emails and questions about the start of the next school year, especially since we have moved into "Phase 2" as per Governor Cooper yesterday. I have met weekly with the Catholic Schools Office and the local Catholic School principals, follow what local school systems and universities are announcing, and receive input from the Diocese and Parish, as well as track what national and state health officials are saying toward steps of a "reopening" plan.

While nothing has been firmly decided yet, there has been some guidance from authorities. We continue to make plans, as best we can, on that information, and will be prepared in August for what we are allowed to do for the continuing excellent education of your children.

I know you need to make personal and financial considerations and decisions for the future. Please be assured that all information is shared widely, completely, and in the most timely manner possible with all of you. Our parents and guardians are our partners in their student's education, and their children's first

teachers, and we don't take that partnership lightly or for granted. We will continue to be transparent in our communications regarding our considerations, and in our plans for the future to all stakeholders.
