The Trust regularly donates vouchers to assist with raffles and fundraisers. Smaller donations are made to assist projects and we do not always name all these donations. Please note that we do not favour cash donations. We are always looking for new projects to extend a helping hand when needed. The aim is not to create dependence but to empower the individual to carry on with the project in a sustainable manner.

GRACE ORGANISATION

The Grace Project is a non-profit, community-based project that reaches out to the marginalised people in different communities throughout Namibia. It contributes towards these people's basic livelihoods, providing them with necessities such as food, clothes, blankets, etc. The project also attends to their psychosocial needs by providing social welfare services such as counselling and referrals to individuals in need.

Henties Medical Outreach 20–22 September 2019

The Grace Project held a Medical Outreach at the town of Henties Bay over the weekend of the 20-22 September with a team of 6 doctors, 2 dentists, a pharmacist and a sonographer, along with approximately 40 volunteers that served the community of Henties Bay with free medical help.

Over the two days, 626 people received medical assistance. The ladies were spoiled with a free manicure and pedicure and the gentlemen received a free haircut and beard trim. Whilst the patients were waiting in line to consult a doctor, they were served with a cooldrink and a sandwich.

Gondwana Care Trust was pleased to sponsor chicken and meat toward the day.

The Grace Project also distributes food packages to the families on a monthly basis, especially to pensioners. Currently about 170 households, which have been identified by board members as well as people in the community, benefit from this aid on an ongoing basis.

Gondwana Care Trust assisted the Grace Organisation by donating N\$30 000.00

worth of groceries for individual Christmas hampers for the elders so they can enjoy the festive season! Thank you for this wonderful initiative.

A lot of the elders have kept their bucket from the previous year, so the Grace Organisation can refill the bucket this year.

Some of the goods purchased with the Gondwana Care Trust sponsorship. The order is placed and the invoice is then paid by the Trust for the goods to be collected.

MARIENTAL PRIMARY SCHOOL

Ms. Swart from Mariental PS has once again decided to have her learners take on the capital city of Namibia by storm! Together with 36 Grade 2 learners and 8 adults, they travelled to Windhoek and back to Mariental by train. For many learners, this was a first-time experience in a train and a fun adventure. The learners visited amongst others, the Parliament, the State house, the museum, and the municipal swimming pool.

Gondwana Care Trust sponsored all 44 return train tickets. Total Value: N\$6 536.00 What an adventure and such a great opportunity for the learners to expand their horizon and visit some of our monuments. Many learners do not get the chance to go on such educational trips.

Many thanks for the dedication of their teacher. The Grade 2 learners enjoyed their trip andit looks like they had loads of fun.

KANONO COMBINED SCHOOL

The school offers I.C.T. (Information, Communication, and Technology) as a subject but only theoretical classes. This is due to the fact that the school does not have a single computer. The school has the infrastructure to receive computers with the possibility of an internet connection. They received Wi-Fi in January 2019.

The school has raised funds towards the project, and after the Gondwana Care Trust agreed on assisting, the classroom was secured with burglar bars and an alarm system was installed.

Gondwana Care Trust purchased the first 10 computers and basic programmes were added with an anti-virus system. Total value: N\$26 500.00 (excl. programmes)

The computers will be delivered in January 2020 when school reopens, since they were only delivered in November at Kanono Combined School. All public schools already closed on 22nd November 2019.

We will need further funds to buy 15 more computers needed by the school by March 2020.

Kanono Combined School is proud to be one of the first schools to offer this subject in the region. To add the practical side of the subject can only benefit the learners. Hope Village is an orphanage in Windhoek (Namibia), which takes care of victims affected

by HIV/AIDS. More than 80 children are currently living there.

Hope Village is situated in the middle of Katutura, a township near Windhoek. It consists of four houses with 24 children in each house. The children are referred to Hope Village by Child Protection, the hospital or a social worker. Furthermore, there is a vegetable garden, producing healthy food for the children.

Gondwana Care Trust sponsored Hope Village with a brand-new fridge and they are now a recipient of the Meals For Two programme. This ensures that the children receive a balanced meal with me. As from next year, they will receive some additional goods to ensure that they receive a healthy meal every day.
