### KALUNDU KINDERGARTEN

Following the wonderful sponsorship of the pre-fabricated classroom by the Gondwana Care Trusts, we paid a visit to the teachers, and the children are extremely happy with their new classroom.

The older children are now able to attend class without disturbances and it creates a comfortable environment for the teachers as well.

Thanks to the Gondwana Care Trusts and The Friends of Namibian Children, the school received some



much-needed stationery and educational material for the children. A brand-new table for the teacher and a standing wash-basin for the children to wash their hands was also sponsored.

### **STEPPING STONE - SWAKOPMUND**

Stepping Stone Trust operates a kindergarten and primary school called Stepping Stone Special Education School. Our pupils have a variety of disabilities including Down Syndrome but we particularly specialise in the teaching of children on the Autism spectrum. Stepping Stone Special Education School is the only private school in Namibia that provides specialised, tailor-made education to children with Autism.



Following our last newsletter, The Delight Swakopmund visited Stepping Stone and donated 10 wooden tables that can be either re-used or recycled by the students.

Stepping Stone has also requested assistance for yoga mats and yoga balls. The benefits of the use of these would include:

#### As chairs:

Especially for children who struggle with attention deficits and an underdeveloped vestibular sense, the yoga ball-chairs improve core stability and improve posture. Studies have also shown that it improves children's behaviour.



### Deep pressure

One of the main uses of the exercise balls and mats at Stepping Stone School are for deep pressure exercises in order to promote body awareness, modulation of the touch and proprioception senses as well as a calming strategy with many children. Sometimes this is done with a whole group of children as part of the daily routine.

### Ball rolling and exercises

- o Improve children's muscle balance, gross motor and mobility skills, especially children who struggle with their mobility
- o Develops core strength
- o Develops hand-eye coordination, which in turn supports fine motor tasks and motor planning tasks such as cutting, writing, threading, opening, closing etc.
- o Fiddle less and get less distracted
- o Improves behaviour and decreases disruptive behaviours in class
- o Creates many effective mid-line crossing exercises to support children with this very important skill in order to work more effectively at reading and writing skills
- o Extension of the children's Occupational Therapy program at school
- o Over-all better sensory integration.
- o Rewarding and motivating activity for most children.

Lidar Foundation is a centre in the heart of Katatura, where many children find themselves living in the street and without adult guidance and protection. Serley, opened the centre to welcome children and teenagers who find themselves in difficult situations such as pregnancy, abused, abandonment, etc. The centre helps the children with a meal during the day, being breakfast before school, lunch and early dinner.

The centre organizes numerous workshops for young mothers so that they can gain credentials and find employment.

The centre has received help from various sponsors, but they are still in need of regular sponsorship for hygienic goods for the teens, dry food and educational material for the children who come to study at the centre after school.

Gondwana Care Trust has sponsored the centre with clothing but also with meat donations. The centre now receives meat twice a month through the MealForTwo project. Gondwana Care Trust has also donated a brand-new freezer and refrigerator.

### **GONDWANA PLANT A TREE DAY 2018**

A few month ago, the Care Trust received the request from the Welwitschia Primary school in Khorixas, to extend the lower primary rest and play area for the learners. A few quotations were received but the project did not get much support due to the very high budget required and the little sustainability the shade net would offer.

Eventually, we received a suggestion from Mr Quintin Hartung – the Environmental officer for Gondwana Collection and thanks to funding received from Miko coffee through their Puro Fairtrade initiative, we decided to use the funding the buy trees for the Welwitschia primary school (Khorixas) and David Khamuxab Primary School (Seringkop).

In September, Gondwana Lodges throughout the country planted various plants at their respective premises and at close-by schools in partnership with the Gondwana Care Trust. One other partner who shares these goals and values with us is Puro Fairtrade Coffee, through their Namibian agency, Miko Coffee. Their Trees for Schools initiative aligns perfectly with Gondwana's quest, and through the companies' business partnership, Puro Coffee sponsored trees to Gondwana to plant at schools.

Through the Puro sponsorship, Damara Mopane Lodge planted eight indigenous shade trees at the Welwitschia Primary School in Khorixas and Etosha Safari Lodge and Camp planted a further eight at the David Khamuxab Primary School, which is on the farm Seringkop near the Etosha Safari properties. These trees were all acquired from the Namib Trees nursery in Windhoek. The Gondwana Canyon Park staff planted twelve shade trees at the nearby Grunua Primary School, whilst assisting with the education of the children, on the importance of trees to the ecosystem, and also planting the correct trees for the specific purpose and environment.

All together close to 100 plants were planted for the Gondwana Plant A Tree Day. Besides the obvious environmental benefits this exercise accomplished, it also gives the participating Gondwana staff a good excuse to get out of their daily routines and dig in the soil a bit, which benefits the body and soul too.

Thank you to Puro Fairtrade Coffee for their generous sponsorship and The Namib Trees and Holoog (Gondwana) nurseries for providing the indigenous plants and for all the Gondwana team members who participated. May we continue to work toward making our planet green again.

































# LITTLE BUGS COMMUNITY SCHOOL & NEEDLEWORK PROJECT

Little Bugs was created out of a dire need for the children in this small community. The children had no choice other than leave their parents to attend school at the coast or in the city. They now have Little Bugs who prepare them for primary school.

The school administrator, Ms Mantas has started a Needlework project to create more opportunities for the women who have had limited access to work opportunities.

The project needed a helping hand to expand their work and following the Award prize won by Namib Desert Lodge for the Responsible Tourism Award 2018, N\$20 000.00 was received, half of these winnings was spent on assisting this wonderful project.

The Needlework project received one sewing machine (worth N\$5 550.00) and some material for sewing to the value of N\$4 450.00.

Thank you to the Namib Desert lodge Team for your commitment and generosity towards Little Bugs. By caring for others, we can only improve our own selfcare.

The other half of the prize money – N\$10 000.00 was donated to NaDeet also based in the Sossusvlei area. NadEET welcomes learners from all around Namibia and teaches the children about sustainability at the centre and offers a unique opportunity for the children to spend time in the desert. Earlier this year the Gondwana Care Trust funded some of the transportation costs for the children to get to the centre, with N\$16 000.00.

# NEW PROJECTS FOR THE CARE TRUST

### **CHOBE KINDERGARTEN**

Situated in the Ngoma Area Teacher: Ms Lydia - awaiting contact details.

The teacher, Ms Lydia, started the kindergarten seven years ago due to the needs of the children in this area. Children had to walk long distances and it was not safe nor convenient. Often parents kept their children from attending kindergarten because of these reasons. Ms Lydia has offered a solution.

The building is close to the Public Primary school, therefore there is access to water and it is safe for the children to walk to school from their nearby villages.

Currently, the bathroom facilities consist of "long-drop / bush toilets", but the facilities are cleaned and well looked after.

The school has a big drum with water, where the children can wash their hands and learn about basic hygiene. Teaching is done in Silozi and English, so the kids are ready to start Grade 1.

As the situation stands, the building is getting too small and interior lighting is limited. ins Therefore, the children are all staying in the main area, which again becomes a challenge for the different age groups all









sitting together. There are 3 dividers in use. The one room destined for the little ones does not have a window and it is way too hot for the kiddies to sleep in.

The kindergarten has very little and not much in the way of funds but the dedication of a few individuals is once again, such an inspiration! Lydia has created opportunities for the children to discover their destination and has involved the parents to access the necessary funds to rent a car with driver to visit parks and other attractions. All the arrangements are co-ordinated by the wonderful teachers. The children even have their school t-Shirt embroidered with their name that they wear during their yearly outings.

The children recently visited the Chobe River Camp to experience tourism and have an overview of what a lodge looks like. Many of these children have had no opportunities to visit lodges and it was a unique experience for them to discover the ins and outs of the lodge.

Thank you to the Chobe River Camp Team for welcoming the children and the time they dedicated to answer the children's questions.

It is our hope to continue to support this kindergarten and very special teacher.

Ms Hartung is a teacher and as many tutors in Namibia, she has found students lacking in basic knowledge on how to interact in everyday situations and on how to respond appropriately in difficult situations a young teenager may find herself. Being bullied or being the bully to protect herself, being a teenager in our society is not always an easy task.

Vanessa has thought of a way to assist teenagers on how to educate themselves by using women of Namibia with a powerful message. Sharing experiences and skills and even messages of hope.

How to respond to unwanted attention and prepare yourself for the future – basic health and hygiene routine, protect yourself against bullies and even get out of the bullying circle, get a role model and learn how to speak in an appropriate manner to one another, respect yourself and others... respond to questions and open a communication channel that may not existed, as many teens grow up far away from their mother.



Vanessa approached the Gondwana Care Trust for support and we were very honoured to assist in a small way by sponsoring 300 filled brötchens and 300 soft drinks to be distributed during the conference which took place on 27 October. Total Value of sponsoring was N\$ 6 505.86.

We hope this conference will the first of many and we wish the very best to all women and teenagers attending the conference.

The shelter is situated on the corner of Luderitz & Daniel Munamava Streets and it provides safe overnight accommodation, amenities, dinner and breakfast for homeless people. The shelter accommodates up to 55 people per night. This shelter is one of very few and offers a safe shelter for homeless individuals.

There are very few places where male or female adults, can get a safe shelter for the night. The shelter has been in operation since 2016 and it runs a program to assist destitute people to re-integrate into society and the job market.



There are few opportunities to get a second chance at life and thanks to the Thimes Bakkes Shelter, many individuals have been given this chance.

We are once again very humbled by the greater good that this team provides, and we are very pleased to have welcomed the Thimes Bakkes Shelter into the MealForTwo program. The centre is now receiving meat donations twice a month and we hope to be able to donate more towards the shelter's feeding program in the future.

Thanks to The Delight Swakopmund's donation of linen and duvets, the Gondwana Care Trust was able to donate these as well as blankets to the shelter. A huge thank you to the Kronsbein family for their donation and so many individuals who leave donations at Gondwana Head office towards this project.
