Gondwana Care Trust MealForTwo lockdown emergency food supplies:

Following the devastating Fire at Twaloloka, the Gondwana Care Trust immediately looked into what can be done to also assist the community.

The Trust was collecting secondhand clothing and blankets for a few weeks and thanks to Alexander Private School, APS in Walvis Bay, we managed to hand out over 50 bags of clothing to the Round Table.

The learners of APS Rotary club managed to collect a lot of children's' clothing and the decision was immediately taken to donate everything to the Twaloloka community.



The Trust is in contact with one of the soup kitchens operating in the Twaloloka district, whereby in a combined effort with TASK, we deliver bread, butter, jam, peanut butter and fruits on demand so that they can hand out this to the children when they serve their meals.





One of the urgent needs was masks for children, as many kids do not have a mask, and some cannot queue to get a meal without wearing a mask. The Gondwana Care Trust purchased 150 children's masks, made locally, so they could be handed out during meal time.



We are so humbled to be able to assist on such a small scale. The Namibian community has been incredibly generous and has made huge donations to the Twaloloka fire victims. So many families were left with absolutely nothing. No home, nothing to cook on and nothing to store food!



This is one of the reasons, that the Trust will continue to assist TASK in order for the children to continue receiving a meal while their parents and families slowly rebuild their homes.



THANK YOU TO EVERYONE INVOLVED! The amazing work done by TASK, Ms Toya Louw and her team, the Round Table and so many other organizations and soup kitchens all over Walvis Bay as well as the church's soup kitchen, that have stood together through this time and have made it possible for so many families to start anew!

ECO-HOMESTEAD NURSERY - Okafitu Kakamba Village

Agnes is a BSc Integrated Environmental Science graduate (UNAM) and has a certificate in SME Enterprise Development and Mentoring from Olafika. Agnes is running a nursery since August 2018 (Eco Homestead) from home in Okafitu Kakamba Village, Anamulenge Constituency, Omusati Region.

She is a environmental enthusiast, persevering to successfully establish a sustainable business for society, the environment and the economy.

The nursery has a variety of plants ranging from indigenous fruit trees such as marina, baobab and jackal berry to mango's papayas, ornamental plants and flowers. However due to lack of funds, progress is evidently very slow.

Agnes has secured 2 hectares of land and also some equipment for the garden, with a 100m shade net being the most valuable addition to grow the nursery and offer the following solutions below. She is also able to make certain internship opportunities for graduates available in the Environmental field of study.

Agnes is really pro-active and hopes to be able to assist with environmental clean-up campaigns and educational training on how to be sustainable and even be able to make a living from this small-scale vegetable farming etc...



Despite a limited budget due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the Gondwana Care Trust still managed to assist Agnes in purchasing the needed fence and poles to secure the land. Total budget: N\$8 598.

Agnes is a young entrepreneur and we would like to wish her the very best in growing the EcoHomestead nursery successfully and at the same time improve the quality of life for many within the community and the well-being of the surrounding environment. Thank you Agnes, we need more young and avid entrepreneurs like you to make our planet a better place for the generation of tomorrow.

Grace Project - Khomasdal Project

Grace Project assists over 180 families. They operate in Khomasdal, Windhoek, and they distribute food parcels to vulnerable families, especially pensioners. Since the Lockdown, they have provided food parcel (maize, pasta, baked beans, fish, soup,



meat bones and what is available) to all the families and together with a home cooked meal.



Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, Grace Project has cancelled all medical outreaches for 2020, but they have provided the elders of the rural towns with a little grocery package. They traveled to

Rietoog and Schlip on 8 August 2020 to assist around 70 elders in each town with a grocery hamper of N\$400 each. They successfully distributed 200 blankets in and around Khomasdal in June 2020. Gondwana Care Trust was able to sponsor 60 packages worth a total of N\$20 600 for the outreach program.


Huis Maerua - Windhoek

Huis Maerua accommodates 24 Children with troubled social backgrounds. They operate in Windhoek and they also receive support through the MealForTwo program. Huis Maerua has "House Parents" who look after the children and provide them with all the TLC they need on a 24 hour basis. Since the Covid-19 crisis started, the house parents have not been able to have a

break and the Gondwana Care Trust sponsored both couples with 2 vouchers for a 2-Nights stay at any Camping2Go site in order for them to get a well-deserved break. Enjoy your stay and thank you for all your love and commitment to the Huis Maerua children over the years.

The Proud Himba Foundation was founded in 2007 with Dallas extending help to the school children of the area. Dallas started with two kids and now he is looking after 28 children on a regular basis. Proud Himba also assists the schools in the area and the orphan feeding program.

The foundation also overlooks the cleaning campaign and keeps in contact with the various needs of the schools in the area.



Ohajuua Primary school, which is also part of the Back to School Xmas bag project, is in urgent need of a solar panel to provide running water to the school. They are currently using the Omarunga lodge's generator until the solar panel can be replaced.



KHOMAS HOMELESS SHELTER - Windhoek:

Based in Khomasdal Community Hall, the shelter provides a daily meal for homeless and vulnerable individuals. The Shelter will usually also provide skill-training and HIV training in cooperation with the Men on the Street Foundation and Women at Work center. The visitors also get assistance if suffering from addiction.

The Shelter is now feeding about 70 to 80 people per day with a meal, three times a week. People can bring a container to take food home as well.

Based in Tsumeb, MAD aims at assisting the youth of Tsumeb to develop skills and enable them to get employed in various industries. They look after 28 families on a regular basis which mostly consist of disabled youth and elderly, visually impaired

or sickly elderly from the Kuvukiland settlement and four widows who live with more than six grandchildren whose parents are unemployed. They are facing constant hardships such as food insecurity, no access to education, basic sanitation, proper healthcare and decent housing.

We are so grateful for everyone involved and for their support and a special thank you to Miss Daniela Jentsch who raised funds and collected clothing, blankets and extra food parcels for the families and delivered all the goods to Tsumeb!



Gondwana Care Trust, through the MealForTwo - Covid-19 Food relief program, was able to deliver once again certain staple goods as well as vegetables to MAD Tsumeb within the past month.

The PAY center is situated in Katutura and welcomes children after school for lunch and homework support and sport activities such as cycling, swimming, soccer, chess etc. Activities are also organized over the weekends to keep the youth physically active and healthy and away from the streets...

PAY started preparing food parcels for the children who were unable to visit the center due to the Lockdown, and they have continued providing food parcels and meals to the children in the area. PAY is a MealForTwo beneficiary and regularly receives meat and staple goods to support the feeding program.

Thanks to Global United FC, we were also able to spoil the young soccer enthusiasts with some T-shirts.





At present PAY have 120 children coming to the center that are provided with a meal. PAY has also distributed food to 69 households in June 2020, reaching 365 people. After distribution 5, they have reached a total of 1777 people.

As every year, Gondwana Care Trust is sponsoring the "Back to School Xmas Bag project" to enable Namibian children to be prepared for their new year at school, encourage the children to stay at school and most of all to put a big smile on their face when they open the Xmas bag which is not only filled with a basic stationery school set but with a gift specially chosen for them!



About 3 years ago, we decided to have a material bag done which could be re-used by the child and be a bit more environmentally friendly.



Schools, hostels, orphanages, OVC Centres send us their list by September/October.

The list must include: Name of the child, gender, age, grade/year and any special needs so we can pack and personalize the bag and pack the right toy and stationery kit for the child.

Each bag has the child's name written on and according to the age and gender, a toy is added to the bag. We have a basic stationery kit included which comprises of pens, pencils, crayons, a ruler, an eraser, a plastic folder, an exercise book, and for older grades we also include a calculator if we have these available.

For the younger kids, we include a colouring book and a reading book with a handwritten message in the book ... For the older kids, we would include a roll on, body cream, toothpaste and toothbrush, soap and a small towel.

Last Xmas 2019, we were very blessed to receive food donations from our partners and we were able to add some maize, sugar and canned fish, so the child would be

able to share a warm meal with the family.



This year has so far been very challenging, yet we continue to hope that we are able to repeat the same donation and we would thank you for sharing this pledge and/or contact us if you are willing to assist us with the Xmas bag project!

Due to the Covid-19 crisis, we were unable to sell the Xmas bags in order to raise funds towards the project.

To all the bags some sweets are added because Xmas is simply not the same without something sweet! Last year we prepared 3 000 Xmas bags and we hope to achieve the same amount this year!

The Back to School Xmas Bags are for sale and for N\$200, you can support a child that will receive the bag on your behalf.

Most schools are still closed but we have centers all over Namibia providing for many children and we will keep the bags for the learners until they return to school. We expect to hand out the bags late December or mid January 2021 and this will still allow the children to have the necessary essentials when going back to school.

Support the Gondwana Care Trust projects

Please find below a list of our Community partners which receive assistance during the Covid-19 crisis:

Heal the Land, Khaibasen, Light of Hope - Okahandja: 160+ children, 44 Adults.

These three organisations run in Okahandja, are connected to a local church whose pastor is the project co-ordinator and drives wekkly to Windhoek to pick up all the goods to distribute thereafter to the beneficiaries. They provide cooked meals to vulnerable and homeless kids in Okahandja. They are also affiliated with the Nau Aib Old Age Home in Okahandja and provide cooked meals to the elderly in the old age home.

Senior Park - Windhoek: 160 residents. Old Age home in Pioneerspark, Windhoek. Meal4Two donations go to the elderly that needs food assistance and for the old age home kitchen. **Lidar Foundation - Katutura**: 250 Children and 100 Adults. Provides food and youth empowerment and educational activities for orphaned and vulnerable girls in Katutura-Central. Since the lockdown, Lidar has prepared meals and food parcels for over 200 kids.

Hope Village: 88 Children. Provides a loving home and food to orphans and abandoned children living with HIV and other debilitating illnesses. Operate in Katutura,

Windhoek PAY Center: 120 Children. Operates in Katutura, Windhoek. Provides nutrient meals and education and physical activity programmes daily to kids coming from disadvantaged backgrounds. Since the lockdown, PAY provides take away food for the kids.

PAY CENTER in Katutura also benefit from the hygienic product as well as food items: During Covid-19 stage 2, they have expanded their reach to 69 households, 80 PAY learners and 365 people. 365 people being the figure based on the number of people per household where we have a minimum of 4 to a maximum of 17 people in each household benefitting from our support...Over 1 777 people have benefited from the program in June 2020...

Huis Maerua: 24 Children. Operates in Windhoek. Houses and feeds children with social welfare troubled backgrounds.

Grace Project: 180 families. Operates in Khomasdal, Windhoek. Distributes food parcels to vulnerable families, especially pensioners. Since the lockdown, they have provided food parcel to almost all the families as well.

Khomas Homeless Shelter - Windhoek: Since the lockdown, the Gondwana Care Trust has added the shelter to the recipient and they have received dry goods and meat to provide a meal on a daily basis to homeless individuals. They have over 70 people visiting the shelter on a regular basis.

Bridge of Hope - Havana: has also been added to the list since the lockdown. They assist over 150 kids with a meals. They still operates and provide take away and food parcel to the kids.

Bridge of Hope is a beneficiary of Meals for Two and receives on a regular basis meat, fish tins and other fresh vegetables to feed the children on a daily basis.

Elshaddai Caring and Feeding: 120 Children and 30 Adults. Operates in Keetmanshoop. Provides nutritious meals daily to kids and adults coming from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Mammadu Trust - Katutura: 60 Children. Operates in Otjomuise, Windhoek and provides food and education to orphaned and vulnerable children in the community.

Dorcas Soup Kitchen - Keetmanshoop: 100 children and 20 adults. Operates in Keetmanshoop. Provides nutritious meals daily to kids coming from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Natascha Pre-Primary School & Day Care - Katutura: 46 children. Operates in Okuryangava, Windhoek, provide food and care to vulnerable children from the community.

Proud Himbas – Opuwo/Epupa Falls:Operates from Epupa and provide food and care for the children through the orphan feeding program and the schools children in the area .

Dagbreek Special School - Windhoek: 26 Children, 7 Adults. Operates in Windhoek provide education, food and shelter to kids with disabilities.

Geduld Primary School and Immanuel Hostel - Grunau: 200 children. Operates in Grunau. Provides education, shelter and food to kids from the Grunau and surrounding area.

Witkrans Primary School - Stampriet: 162 children and 8 adults. Provide nutrient meals for underprivileged children from the Witkrans area.
