A short follow-up on one of the projects we featured in our last newsletter.

ESB ROCKET STOVE - Namibia

The ESB Rocket Stove is an efficient and user-friendly stove made of mild steel. It is an old, tried and tested design, that has been revived and adapted to Namibian conditions. It was not designed by ESB, as the concept has been on the market internationally for a while, but ESB has now started to manufacture these stoves for several reasons, one of which is to have a positive social impact on both the Namibian community and the environment. Every year, many trees are cut down for firewood, especially in winter. There are a few towns that do not have any access to natural firewood, such as the coastal Walvis Bay area. The accident rate of open fires remains high and too many have suffered the disastrous consequences of shacks burning down in Namibia. Too many homes don't have access to electricity and therefore families don't have a choice and must use firewood to cook their meals and boil water.







The ESB Rocket Stove is super-fast, saves wood (it only uses sticks and twigs) and it is safer to use as it is not an open fire and it provides heat during the cold winter nights. It is easy to use, clean, and can be used by all. The ESB Rocket Stove (L: 450mm x W:300mm x H: 600mm & weighs 7kg) costs N\$699. ESB is looking for sponsors to donate towards families in need.

There are many families in need of such a stove, especially in the northern rural areas of Namibia which have been flooded and families have lost most of their belongings. This is a Namibian product made for Namibians, and to sponsor some families in need will be a life-changing donation for many! Thank you!

KHAIBASEN & HEAL THE LAND - Okahandja

Through Pastor Willie Theron, the Trust is able to extend a helping hand to the most vulnerable in some parts of the Okahandja district and most particularly through Khaibasen; which remains active in order to continue their feeding program towards the street children and the dumpsite children.

Please once again, any assistance that you can give us so that we can continue supporting Paulina and Willie is indeed very much welcomed!!

Since our last newsletter, we have continued to deliver food to Heal the Land, Light of Hope, Khabaisen and Nau Aib Old Age Home in Okahandja and we have been able to increase some of the delivery as well as the need increases every day.

Since our last newsletter, just over 500 children have received a meal once a day. Again, all the health precautions and sanitary measures are in place and only 10 children are allowed at one time. As Okahandja advances into stage 3, more children are able to get a meal!



Since the COVID-19 crisis started, Paulina has been able to increase the number of children she is feeding to over 130 a day, as the number of children allowed at a time to receive a meal has increased. Okahandja is now in stage 3.

The line is getting longer every week with more children in need of a meal to survive the day. About 30 families in need also received food parcels, each consisting of 6 to 8 members. Nau Aib served over 352 meals and 88 snacks. We thank you on behalf of the 44 residents who are unable to shop for themselves, especially in the restricted conditions during lockdown. This still carries on for many residents who have very little to survive on and almost no income to spare.

KHOMAS HOMELESS SHELTER - Windhoek:

Based in Khomasdal Community Hall, the shelter provides a daily meal to the homeless, as well as vulnerable individuals. The shelter will, once things are back to normal, provide skills and HIV training in co-operation with the Men on the Street Foundation and Women at Work Centre.

Visitors also get assistance in case of addictions and learn skills to cope and shake off the habit for good.

The shelter is now feeding one meal per day, three times a week, to about 70 to 80 people. People can bring a container to take food home as well.

Based in Tsumeb, MAD aims at assisting the youth of Tsumeb to develop skills and enable them to get employed in various industries. They look after 28 families on a regular basis, which mostly consist of disabled youth and elderly, visually impaired or sickly elderly from the Kuvukiland settlement and four widows who live with more than 6 grandchildren whose parents are unemployed. They are facing material hardships such as food insecurity, no access to education, basic sanitation, proper healthcare or descent housing.

MAD is also in need of more protective gear to use when delivering the parcels during the lockdown: they are on the regional councilor special list to be able to provide these services during this period.

Recently the Gondwana Care Trust was able to assist MAD with basic items for their special needs and food parcels. Thanks to our recent sponsors, we will be able to add fruit and vegetables to our next delivery, as well as more needed items such as adult diapers and other hygienic goods that are much needed.

Following a few emails, the Gondwana House team in Windhoek managed to get a wheelchair for one of the beneficiaries who was recently paralyzed. The lady was left with nothing and would not be able to move without assistance. We would like to **THANK WINDHOEK ROTARY CLUB** for donating a brand-new wheelchair to Ms Rosa. We cannot thank you enough for your sponsorship! Thank you as well to Pina Gubiani and Hester Coetzee for the other wheelchair that will also be donated to another beneficiary of MAD Tsumeb.



We are so grateful for everyone involved and for their support.

Gondwana Care Trust, through the MealForTwo - COVID Food relief, was once again able to deliver some dry goods as well as vegetables to MAD Tsumeb during the past month.

A total of 48 families benefits from the food donations. Thank you to all our sponsors for your continuous support and trust. Delivery is either done by Sea Pride or African Marketing.



Follow-up on little Ruth - following our last newsletter requesting some assistance for Ruth - we are still awaiting the report from the therapist in order to get the required chair for Ruth. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, it is very difficult to get an appointment with the therapist in Windhoek.

Ruth had her present wheelchair since she was 6 years old. She has totally outgrown the chair and the chair has now collapsed! Ruth is 13 years old and has been paralysed since birth. She needs a special chair that can hold her neck and keep her stable.





One of the benefits from our search for the chair is that we have managed to have MAD and Side by Side get in contact.

Side by Side has organized a workshop together with MAD for some of the MAD beneficiaries from 22 June 2020 to 27 June 2020 in Tsumeb.

Side by Side Early Intervention Centre, is a registered non-profit association offering services and support to children with disabilities and their families. They provide training, community rehabilitation and awareness throughout Namibia. Side by Side rely solely on grants and sponsorships. They have eight voluntary staff members including a reflexologist, social worker, occupational therapist, speech therapist and an orthopaedical therapist.



Services offered by the Side-by-Side team:

- Day Care Rehabilitation Centre / Early Intervention Sessions / Home Visits
- Parent Workshops / Support Groups
- Special School Readiness / Individual Sponsorship programs / School, Public and Corporate Awareness Campaigns

Gondwana Care Trust is covering the catering expenses for the workshop over 6 days, which includes breakfast and lunch for 10 persons per day. Side by Side will enable a few families to learn the best techniques on how to look after their children with special needs and provide the families with support as well.

The workshop from 22 June to 27 June 2020 welcomed almost 20 people each day. Gondwana Care Trust was honoured to be able to contribute. We look forward to have more workshops organized around Namibia to assist families in need of support, emotionally as well as learning important skills to improve the mobility and mental ability of their children. Please note that for some exercises, masks had to be removed to show facial expressions. It is important to work with body language, facial expression and tone of voice in some cases. Thank you for your understanding.

So many family members are deprived of any assistance and are unable to look after the child as they should. They have no knowledge on how to massage the child and/or on how to stimulate responses that would enable a better quality of life for the child.




This type of workshop is such an essential part to improving our knowledge on disability. It also teaches how to assist the community to embrace everyone and improve our communication to understand that disability can be helped.

Huipie is also assisting little Ruth to get an appointment and eventually get the right chair so she can improve her quality of life. We will keep you updated as we get information on her progress. As soon as we get the report, we can look into more assistance.

There are unfortunately more children in need of special chairs - a CP specialised chair or an electric chair. The need is endless and should you be interested to assist or get more information, please contact me directly, Ms Huipie van Wyk or Ms Violet from MAD.

Together we can make a difference in a child's life.

Only one child is allowed during therapy and group therapy stopped during stage 1 and 2.



Gondwana Care Trust assisted Hands of Hope and specifically a special little girl in need of assistance as she is undergoing regular operations for a rare condition. We were very blessed to be able to spoil Natrovhina aka Blomi with a Gondwana Care Trust bag filled with some gifts as well so she can continue making progress with her hand coordination. Blomi is blind and paralysed but her mom continues all sorts of activities, like colouring and reading to her to stimulate her senses. Her siblings describe the drawing and she would choose colours as she has not always been blind and can recall colours and shapes. Even with her paralysis, Blomi can still sit and use her hands.

<u>Please find below a list of our community partners who receive assistance during the lockdown and stage 3:</u>

Heal the Land, Khaibasen, Light of Hope - Okahandja: 160+ children, 44 adults.

These three organisations in Okahandja are connected to a local church whose pastor is the project co-ordinator and drives to Windhoek weekly to pick up all the goods to distribute thereafter to the beneficiaries. They provide cooked meals to vulnerable and homeless children in Okahandja. They are also affiliated with the Nau Aib Old Age Home in Okahandja and provide cooked meals to the elderly in the old age home.

MEGS Care for Needy - Katutura: 60+ families.

Operates in Khomasdal and Katutura, Windhoek providing food parcels and cooked meals to vulnerable elderly people in those communities. Since the lockdown started, they have assisted over 100 people with food parcels. *Please note that MEGS is no longer a MealForTwo recipient due to unforeseen reasons*.

Senior Park - Windhoek: 160 residents.

Old Age home in Pioneerspark, Windhoek. MealForTwo donations go to the elderly who need food assistance and for the old age home kitchen.

Lidar Foundation - Katutura: 250 children and 100 adults.

Provides food, youth empowerment and educational activities for orphaned and vulnerable girls in Katutura Central. Since the lockdown, Lidar has prepared meals and food parcels for over 200 kids.





Hope Village: 88 children.

Provides a loving home and food to orphans and abandoned children living with HIV and other debilitating illnesses. Operates in Katutura.

Windhoek PAY Center: 120 children.

Operates in Katutura, Windhoek. Provides nutritious meals and education and physical activity programmes daily to children coming from disadvantaged backgrounds. Since the lockdown, PAY provides take away food for the children.

PAY CENTER in Katutura also benefits from hygienic products as well as food items: During COVID-19 stage 2, they have expanded their reach to 69 households, 80 PAY learners and 365 people. 365 is the figure based on the number of people per household where we have a minimum of four to a maximum of seventeen people in each household benefitting from our support. Over 1 777 people have benefited from the programme in June 2020.

Huis Maerua: 24 children.

Operates in Windhoek. Houses and feeds children with social welfare troubled backgrounds.

Grace Project: 180 families.

Operates in Khomasdal, Windhoek. Distributes food parcels to vulnerable families, especially pensioners. Since the lockdown, they have provided food parcels to almost all the families as well.

Khomas Homeless Shelter - Windhoek:

Since the lockdown, the Gondwana Care Trust has added the shelter as recipient. They have received dry goods and meat to provide a meal on a daily basis to homeless individuals. They have over 70 people visiting the shelter on a regular basis.

Bridge of Hope - Havana:

Has also been added to the list since the lockdown. They provide over 150 children with meals. They still operate and provide take aways and food parcels to the children.

Gondwana Care Trust also purchased 1 000 face masks of which 140 were donated to Bridge of Hope supporting and feeding children in their surrounding community so they can have a warm meal during the day. Thank you, Miss Eugenia, for your care and love towards the children.

Recipients of the 1000 masks purchased by Gondwana Care Trust:

PAY Namibia: 230 Masks, Huis Mearua: 12, Windhoek Technical High School (HTS): 400, Delta Sec School: 138, Nau Aib Old Age Home: 80 & Bridge Of Hope: 140

Bridge of Hope is a beneficiary of MealForTwo and regularly receives meat, fish tins and other fresh vegetables to feed the children on a daily basis.

Elshaddai Caring and Feeding: 120 Children and 30 Adults.

Operates in Keetmanshoop. Provides nutritious meals daily to children and adults coming from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Mammadu Trust - Katutura: 60 Children.

Operates in Otjomuise, Windhoek and provides food and education to orphaned and vulnerable children in the community.

Part of the MealForTwo programme - Associations / schools are closed at the moment:

Dagbreek Special School - Windhoek: 26 Children, 7 Adults.

Operates in Windhoek and provides education, food and shelter to children with disabilities.

Dorcas Soup Kitchen - Keetmanshoop: 100 children and 20 adults.

Operates in Keetmanshoop. Provides nutritious meals daily to children coming from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Geduld Primary School and Immanuel Hostel - Grunau: 200 children.

Operates in Grunau. Provides education, shelter and food to children from the Grunau and surrounding area.

Witkrans Primary School - Stampriet: 162 children and 8 adults.

Provides nutritious meals for underprivileged children from the Witkrans area.

Natascha Pre-Primary School & Day Care - Katutura: 46 children.

Operates in Okuryangava, Windhoek, provides food and care to vulnerable children from the community.

We are looking for blankets and warm winter clothes as winter is fast approaching.
